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 Leadership	A group of local leaders appoints a committee to coordinate and carry out the work.	The committee appoints a Preaching Movement Coordinator with the oversight of the Director and Regional Coordinator.	The committee meets regularly under leadership of a Preaching Movement Coordinator ensuring information is being distributed efficiently and effectively.	A strategy for nurturing the movement is being followed by the committee, Director and Regional Coordinator and is revised as needed.
